Come join us at the Museum of Natural History in Morro Bay for a week of activities during Spring break. All programs begin at 2:00 pm in the auditorium or learning center and will be 1-2 hours long.

Monday 17 April Finding Bones

Have you ever found a skeleton of a dead animal or bird in your yard? Docents will discuss past and current skeleton preparations and a selection of bones will be available for everybody to identify and link with partner bones. Good for ages 10 and up.

Tuesday 18 April Eyesight and Eyeball Dissection

Hear a talk on the parts of the mammalian eye and common problems. Then do a guided dissection of preserved sheep eyes. Ages 7 and up with parental help.

Wednesday 19 April Fish - Inside and Out

Learn about body parts of different fish and then dissect them to see what they look like inside too. This is in the Learning Center. Ages 10 and up, sharp blades involved.

Thursday 20 April Puppets: Home at the Rookery

A puppet show about the problems Mom and Pop Blue Heron have hatching their chicks and feeding them and a discussion of the birds in the local rookery. Family event..

Friday 21 April Bird Nests and Eggs

Come observe the Museum's collections of bird nests and eggs and then be inspired to create your very own felted birds nest and eggs using wool. Instructions and materials will be provided. Family event.

Saturday 22 April Owl Pellet Dissection

Learn about owl pellets-what they are, what owls are involved, how they are made, what they might contain-and dissect a pellet to find the bones and other materials in them. Family event.
